

Using Copyright-Protected Works for Tests or Exams

The *Copyright Act* includes an exception for educational institutions that permits the **Reproduction, Translation, Communication, and Performance** of copyright-protected works for use in tests and exams.

*Refer to Section 29.4(2) of the *Copyright Act*.

Reproduction: Images, diagrams, or text from a copyright-protected work can be copied.

Translation: Passages of text from a copyright-protected work can be translated into another language.

Communication: You may make a copy or translation of a copyright-protected work available to your students by posting the test or exam on your college's learning management system.

Performance: Showing a film in the classroom or having your student re-enact a scene from a play is permitted.

Always cite your source! Remember to acknowledge the source and author of the copyright-protected work that has been reproduced, translated, communicated, or performed.

Properly cited tests and exams can be:

- Distributed to students in your classroom in paper format.
- Posted to FOL.
