

Plagiarism

There are 4 kinds of **Plagiarism**:



#1: Submitting someone else's work as your own.



#3: Submitting someone else's electronic files or data as your own.

#2: Not citing someone else's work & improperly citing.

#4: Submitting your own work more than once.

Often referred to as 'Double Submission'.

Plagiarism is an **Academic Offence**.

- Can result in **Warnings** with **Actions Taken** like re-do work, reduced marks, mark of zero.
- Can result in **Penalties** of **Re-do Work**, **Mark of Zero**, **Fail Course**.

How to Avoid Plagiarism...



Don't upload or download assignments from course content sharing sites like Course Hero or StuDocU.



Do ask your Course Instructor if you have any questions about assignments.



Don't use Spin Bots or Word Generators.

They may reduce your TurnItIn score but **they increase your risk of Academic Offences, Warnings, and Penalties.**



Do prepare, complete, and submit your own work.



Don't share your academic work with anyone.

Protect your academic work!



Do cite and cite properly whenever you paraphrase or copy text in your assignment.

- Paraphrased text needs a (citation).
- Copied text needs "quotation marks" and a (citation).
- Include full source information in a **References List**.
