


Quizzes, Tests, and Exams


Evaluations are opportunities for each individual student to demonstrate their own understanding of course content and earn marks and grades for their own work.

Will result in **Penalties**

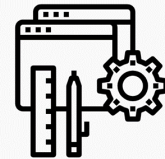
- Mark of Zero

How to achieve and maintain Academic Integrity during Evaluations



Don't talk to, communicate with, or collaborate with anyone while an evaluation is in progress.



Don't use materials, resources, technology, or tools that are not permitted in an evaluation.



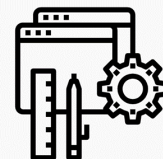
Don't have phones or any other devices in use or within reach.



Don't access or share answers, questions, or information from or about evaluations.



Do ask your Course Instructor if you have any questions about an evaluation.

Do use the evaluation to demonstrate your own understanding of course content.
